## Goals and values that mirror you own

The Adult Day Program at Globe Star University (GSU) is committed to four key tenets:

### ***Volunteerism***

provides volunteer opportunities that enable program participants to establish meaningful connections with others in the community who share a similar interests.

### ***Education and Skills Development***

offers education and training in functional skill development that focuses on individual strengths and interests.

### ***Community Integration***

identifies and nurtures opportunities for participants to be involved in leisure and recreational activities of interest to them, and facilitates their use of such community resources as libraries, parks, museums, theaters, festivals, etc.

### ***Pre-Vocational Skill Training***

provides training in specific job-related skills based on individual strengths, weaknesses, likes, and dislikes, empowering them to pursue employment in an area of matched interest.
